## How to ace group projects

We know you probably hear the phrase 'group project' and immediately suppress a groan. A career as a sommelier offers many part-time opportunities, with majority of sommeliers working part-time. This flexibility can be ideal for those looking to balance work with other commitments.

As a sommelier, you might find yourself working in a variety of environments, such as cafes, restaurants, or outdoor settings like vineyards or distilleries.

Working in the hospitality industry generally requires availability on weekends and late nights, as well as the potential for shift work. However, this also means that you'll have a lot more flexibility in your working hours – perfect for those looking for a more diverse work schedule.

#### How to become a Sommelier

While it isn't strictly necessary to have formal qualifications to work as a Sommelier, there are lots of courses you can take to help you get your foot in the door. Pathways to becoming a Sommelier often include a combination of on-the-job experience and education.

You could start by working in the hospitality industry in a restaurant or winery – if serving alcohol, you'll need an RSA certification in Australia – and work your way up, but most Sommeliers also complete an accredited education program such as one from the Wine & Spirit Education Trust (WSET).

To excel in the field, you could then obtain VET qualifications within the hospitality and viticulture industries. This could include courses such as:

- <u>Diploma of Viticulture</u>
- Certificate II in Wine Industry Operations

If you wanted to be at the top of your game, you could also consider up-skilling with a course from the Court of Master Sommeliers.

#### What can I do now to work towards this career?

If you're in high school and you'd like to find out if a career as a Sommelier is right for you, here's a few things you could do right now:

- **Build your knowledge:** Start learning about different types of wines, their origins, flavors, and pairings. You can begin by reading books on wine appreciation or exploring online resources that discuss various aspects of wine production and tasting.
- **Volunteer or gain experience:** Look for opportunities to gain practical experience in hospitality settings, such as restaurants or wineries. Even shadowing a sommelier for a day can provide valuable insights into the daily responsibilities and skills required for the job.
- **Obtain your RSA:** This is a valuable certification to have, so check your state requirements and see if you're eligible to get your RSA there are lots of online courses available

## How to ask for a letter of recommendation

#### Guidelines

#### 7. Show gratitude

**Example:** "Thank you so much for taking the time to write the recommendation letter for me. Your support means a lot, and I'm very grateful."
